NUMBERS & NOTES

CROSS COUNTRY: The Bobcat girls won the TCC as Lisa Dumkow placed 2nd overall in the league. At th Regional, Whiteford placed 3rd with Dumkow being the highest finisher (5th). At the state meet, the team placed 24th. For the boys, Ken Donley placed ninth in the Regional.

GIRLS BASKETBALL: Longtime boys coach John Rice took the reigns of the girls team and led the squad to double digits in wins. Chelsea Keeling averaged 15 points.

FOOTBALL: Two victories to close the season couldn't lift the Bobcats to a playoff appearance, but it was enough for yet another winning season for Coach Jack Luettkie. Jed Bunge led the team in rushing, passing and scoring, the first Bobcat quarterback to do so in decades. He was an All-Region choice.

BOYS BASKETBALL: Jake Gust became the third Gust brother to lead Whiteford in

scoring, following in the footsteps of Nate and Joe. Gust averaged 16.0 points a game.

Mitch Frazier led Whiteford in three-pointers. Freshman Josh DuPree made his Bobcat debut by scoring more than 120 points, including a 25-point game against Britton, the most points ever scored in a game by a Bobcat ninth-grader.

BASEBALL: Josh Weible put together an outstanding season on the hill for the Bobcats, winning 10 games while striking out 52 batters and walking only 13 in 57 innings pitched. His pitching prowess helped lift the Bobcats to 22 wins and a TCC title under coach Matt VanBrandt. A host of big hitters led the team from the plate. Chuck Tabbert batted .449 and led the team in RBI. Chase Johnson batted .411 and scored 29 times. Mitch Frazier hit .350 and Jake Gust batted .377 with 5 doubles.

TRACK: Whiteford's boys placed sixth at

the state meet, getting several individuals with outstanding performances. George Flanner was 5th in the discus and 8th in the shot put. Keagen Puse placed 4th in one hurdle race and first in another. The 800 relay team of Anthony LaRocca, Josh DuPree, Puse and Nate Seevers placed 2nd.

Leesa Draper's girls team its seventh straight winning season. Chelsea Keeling placed in three events at the state meet, placing fourth in the 100, and 400 and 8th in the 200.

SOFTBALL: Grace Lee and Ashleigh Barron were co-MVPs for the Bobcats, which won 20 games. Barron led the team in average, hits and runs while Jayme Kurek was the team RBI leader. Barron had an on-base percentage of .426 and struckout only twice in 103 at-bats.
